The 2008 B.U.S. Boycotts occur between the dates which mark the deaths of the Mother (Mrs. Rosa Parks) and the Leader of the Civil Rights Movement (Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.). Participants become change agents as volunteers who refuse to give up precious freedoms and refuse to conduct acts which contribute to imbalances within the criminal justice system such as negative contact with law enforcement.
